Xhabir Memedi Deralla

Biography

Xhabir Memedi Deralla (b. 1967) is a human rights activist, journalist, author, and hybrid warfare analyst. He is the founder and head of **CIVIL – Center for Freedom**, a human rights organization based in North Macedonia since 1999, and an active contributor to efforts countering disinformation, authoritarianism, and hybrid warfare.

As the head of CIVIL, Deralla leads the organization's research and strategic initiatives in several critical areas, including disinformation, hybrid threats, elections, and authoritarian tendencies. Under his leadership, CIVIL has launched numerous campaigns addressing pressing social and political issues in North Macedonia and across the Western Balkans. The organization is also a senior member of the International Action Network on Small Arms (IANSA) and is recognized for its work in arms control, democratic resilience, and civic participation.

Deralla also serves as editor-in-chief of CIVIL's media platform and contributes regularly as an analyst, author, and columnist for media outlets in North Macedonia, the region, and internationally. His media career began in 1989, and he has since contributed to numerous domestic and international media organizations. He has been a member of the Association of Journalists of North Macedonia since 1990 and a member of Amnesty International since 1994.

In 2023, he was awarded the **Order of Merit** by Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky for his efforts in countering Russian propaganda. In 2024, he received the **Southeast Europe Association's Solidarity Award** for his contributions to journalism in the region.

As a result of his outspoken activism and views, Deralla has been subjected to hate speech and death threats from ultranationalist and pro-Russian political actors and radical groups.
